

## FY 19 State Funded Programs: Definitions and Providers

### CASE MANAGEMENT

1:1 services for adults, children / youth, and families. Works with individual to identify goals, supports, services, and resources in the community. Involves in-home consultation and intervention, participation in special education school planning, life skills training, and contracting / monitoring of needed services. Includes intensive, long-term support and revision of plan of services for as long as needed.

### DAY PROGRAMS/CLUBHOUSES

Services provided to multiple individuals in a facility and community-based setting. Programs operate five days a week and provide educational, vocational, and therapeutic social environments for persons with brain injury. Clubhouse members participate in a work-ordered day to run the program; day programs are typically more educational and social in nature

### RESOURCE COORDINATION

Outreach to people treated for brain injury and reported to Trauma Registry; I&R and consultation / technical assistance services; training and public awareness activities; and advocacy to enhance services. Primary functions are to offer education on brain injury; provide a point of entry to available supports and services; and develop partnerships with individuals and organizations across the state
